

## HISTORY OF OXFORD CIRCLE GROUP OF NA

In 1971, The Oxford Circle Group of NA originally started as The Boulevard Group of NA by four addicts seeking a meeting on Friday night. It's first meeting was held at the First Christian Church of Christ at 10th and Roosevelt Blvd. The group held several 50/50 drawings at this location. The group remained at this location until 1975, and then moved to 13th and Ruscomb Street at the Muhlenberg Luthern Church.

In 1976 there were 16 meetings held in Pennsylvania and it was the second largest state to have NA meetings. The Oxford Circle Group of NA was the first NA meeting to be held in Philadelphia.

The group grew and moved to its current location and changed its name to The Oxford Circle Group Of NA. Meetings were still held on Fridays evenings at 7:30.

During the new century, the group had changed and the majority of the original members moved on and sought to help other groups to grow within the area. The group had struggle with the change, but remain to keep the doors open.

Today the group has grown with new members who continues to strive and perservere to provide an atmosphere of recovery for any addict seeking recovery.
