## USPHS Hospital Notes Anniversary

The United States Public Health Service hospital on the Leestown pike will celebrate Friday the 15th anniversary of its dedication on Friday, Dr. Victor Vogel, medical officer in charge, said today.

Fifty-six members of the hospital staff who have been employed there since the institution opened in 1935 will be guests of honor at a dinner dance to be held at the Phoenix hotel Friday night.

Asst. Surgeon Gen. R. C. Williams, Washington, will be principal speaker. Dr. G. Halsey Hunt, Washington, chief of the division of hospitals, also will attend. Lexington Chamber of Commerce directors who were instrumental in locating the hospital here have been invited.

Dr. Vogel said the hospital staff now numbered 520, almost double the number employed when the hospital opened. The institution has admitted 14,147 patients for treatment since 1935 and the patient population now stands at a record 1,440.

Dr. Vogel was a member of the staff in 1935, when Dr. Lawrence Kolb was the first medical officer in charge. Other medical officers in charge have been Dr. Walter L. Treadway and Dr. John D. Reichard.
