A bunch of drug addicts in a room together—gimme a break.

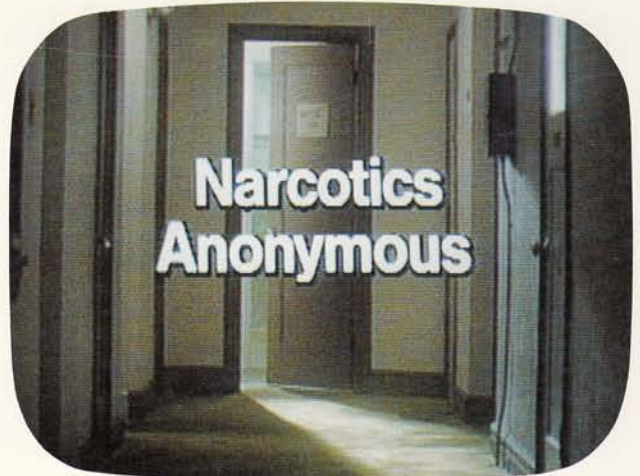


But it was weird, no matter what anyone said nobody was surprised. Other people felt the same way.

Man In Phone Booth



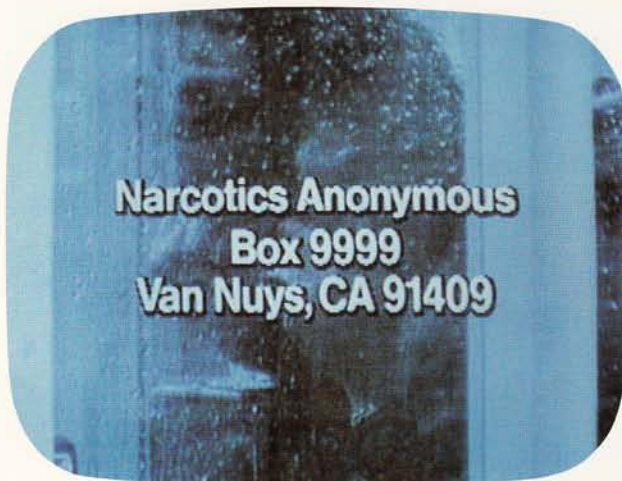
I remember how scared I was. I was desperate. I know I was desperate because I wouldn't have called otherwise.

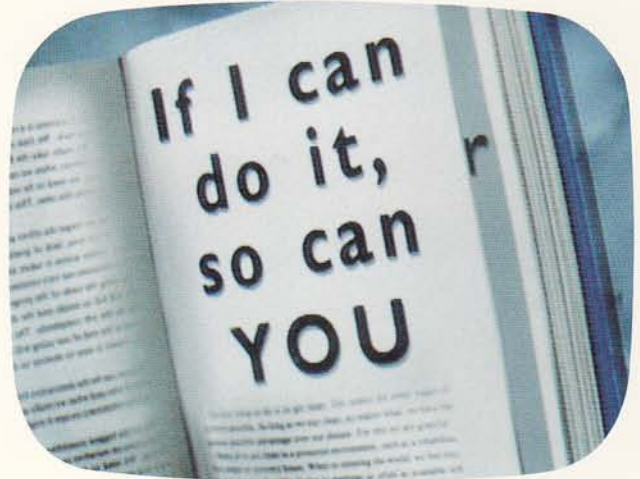


The Basic Text

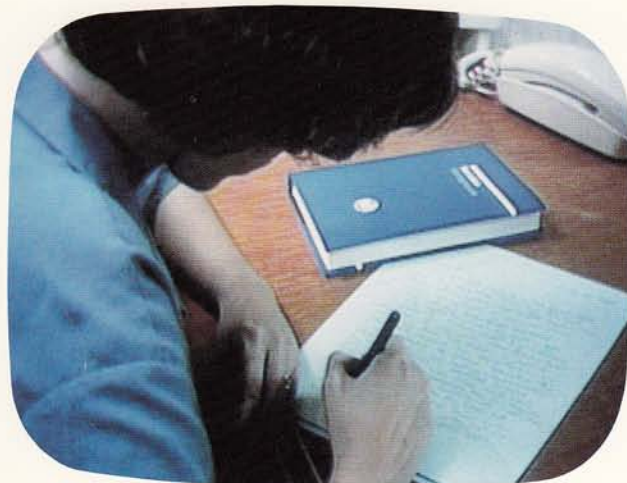
Woman At Table
